

## Smooth Blending Demo

The Grants Program was presented by Marilyn Sarber and Becky Gromlich on the Smooth Blending Technique they learned at the SWS Birgit O'Connor Workshop last spring. Marilyn explained the process used in prepping for the workshop, materials, as well as challenges and learning gained. She presented a finished piece of cactus flowers.

Becky then demonstrated the process on the video screen. Large soft quill style brushes are used to drop color into the wet area and then paint is moved around by tilting the paper. The paint is the "consistency of skim milk." The result is a smooth area without brush marks. It is a patient process with several layers applied to achieve the shape of the petal. Becky also brought a couple of finished paintings from the workshop to share. The member group then jumped in and gave it a try.

### Monthly Tip

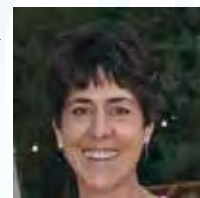
#### Traveling With Watercolors

It's fun to capture vacation scenes in watercolor or maybe you are traveling for a workshop. When traveling on an airplane with watercolors there are a few things to consider. Dry pans are convenient but liquid watercolors, because they are not flammable, may also be transported in carried or checked baggage. TSA restrictions mandate paint must be less than 3.4 oz and packed in one clear zip top bag with other liquids and gels you are carrying on board. (\*The best option is to put them in checked luggage labeled "watercolor pigments.") Any sharp objects or palette knives must be in checked bags. Varnish is flammable and may not be carried on airplanes at all. Finished paintings and paper are not restricted. Packing

them in a portfolio and carrying it on board is usually the best option. Safe travels! (reference: "Traveling on Airplanes with Watercolors" @ [getawaytips.azcentral.com](http://getawaytips.azcentral.com))
